- Arab Barometer is a nonpartisan research network that provides insight into the social, political, and economic attitudes and values of ordinary citizens across the Arab world
- ► Arab Barometer goals
 - 1. Track attitudes & behavior
 - 2. Build institutional capacity
 - 3. Disseminate knowledge about ordinary citizens living in MENA

About the surveys

- ► More than 75,000 interviews to date
- ► 55 nationally representative surveys
- ► Six waves across 15 countries
 - ► Wave 1 (2006-7) in 7 countries
 - Wave 2 (2010-11) in 10 countries
 - Wave 3 (2012-14) in 12 countries
 - Wave 4 (2016-17) in 7 countries
 - Wave 5 (2018-19) in 12 countries
 - ► Wave 6 (2020) in 5 countries
- ▶ Data are publicly available for download and analysis at arabbarometer.org

Methodological issues during COVID

Arab Barometer 6th wave

- ▶ Phone surveys due to health risks associated with in-person interviews due to COVID-19
- Four rounds of surveys in each country in fall 2020
- Completed surveys: Algeria, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, & Tunisia
- ► To be completed: Iraq, Kuwait, & Libya
- Based on a random sample of 1,000 respondents per country using random-digit dialing (RDD) techniques.
- Used recontact list based on sample of 350,000 phone numbers in Lebanon.
- Surveys conducted by local partners across the region






Concern about COVID




Extent of concern about COVID-19 spreading over the the next 6 months




Reason for Concern







Fear of COVID on the rise in Tunisia




Women are more concerned about COVID






Fear of losing source of income





Concern for losing main source of income in next 12 months

% saying very or somewhat concerned by gender




Violence against women







Trust in government




Trust in government-reported statistics on infection and death rates caused by COVID-19 % saying a great deal or quite a lot of trust




Government performance & COVID




Evaluation of government performance in responding to COVID-19 outbreak
