

- 4 major areas
- 17 regions
- 82 provinces
- 1,487 municipalities
- 7,641 islands
- 301,000 km²
- 2020 population = 109.04M

Social Weather Stations (www.sws.org.ph)

- Established in August 1985
- private, non-stock, non-profit and politically non-partisan survey research institution
- 734 surveys (337 national + 397 subnational) as of October 2022
- 131,268 survey questions



Social Weather Report (SWR) Surveys

- SWRs regularly cover past and future quality of life, satisfaction with governance, poverty and hunger, crime and opinion on contemporary issues.
- Conducted twice a year during 1986-1991, quarterly since 1992, across 6 regimes:
 - Corazon Aquino (1986-1992)
 - Fidel Ramos (1992-1998)
 - Joseph Estrada (1998-2001)
 - Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo (2001-2010)
 - Benigno Simeon Aquino III (2010-2016)
 - Rodrigo Duterte (2016-2022)



SWR Methodology

- National surveys of at least 1,200 adults (age 18+)
- Multi-stage sampling
 - Select provinces and barangays (villages) using Probability Proportional to Size (PPS) sampling
 - Systematically select dwelling units within sample barangays/villages
 - Randomly select qualified respondent within the sampled household



Citizen Well-being

- Past quality of life (Gainers vs Losers)
- Future quality of life (Optimists vs Pessimists)

Satisfaction with Governance

- Satisfaction rating of the President
- Satisfaction rating of the Vice-President,
- Satisfaction rating of the National Administration on the overall and on specific issues

Will be better (Optimists)










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NET SATISFACTION RATINGS* OF PRESIDENTS: PHILIPPINES, MAY 1986 TO JUN 2022



NET SATISFACTION RATINGS* OF VICE-PRESIDENTS, PHILIPPINES, OCT 1986 TO JUN 2022





SUMMARY

- Gainers high since 2014
- Optimism generally higher than pessimism across administrations
- Honeymoon ratings for presidents, with varying lengths
- Highest net satisfaction rating during B. Aquino and Duterte administrations
- Positive correlation between citizen well-being and satisfaction with governance, except during B. Aquino's administration.



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
